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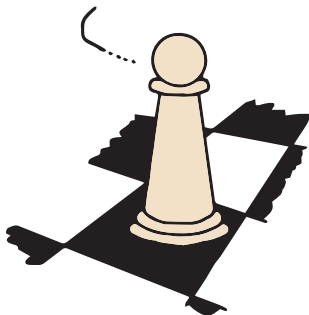
I'M GOING TO BE A LITTLE LATE.

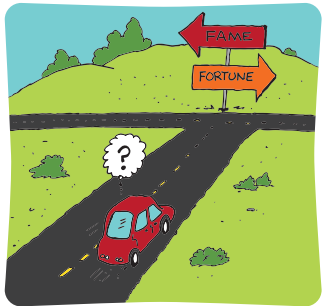
